Re: Item #7: Regional Public Safety Information Sharing Update

Staff Recommendation:

Action or Discussion Items:

Discussion only. This item updates the Approval Authority on regional public safety information sharing initiatives supported with UASI funds. The last update was provided in May 2013. The Management Team will provide another update in six months to ensure that progress continues as expected.

Discussion:

The table below provides a status update on regional public safety information sharing systems by UASI Operational Area. Highlights include:

- Alameda County law enforcement agencies have agreed to join ARIES, increasing the number of agency users by 18.
- Contra Costa County is leading a project to re-architect the current data warehouse to provide a more efficient and robust system. This work has delayed the full integration of ARIES and CopLink by another six months.
- San Francisco PD is currently working with FBI N-DEX to integrate their data. N-DEX will exchange this data with CopLink and then ARIES after full of integration of CopLink and ARIES.
